The second Šibenik expedition on Kilimanjaro

We have found our new mountain

After each expedition, a mountaineer prepares for a new one: if we are lucky enough we shall ascend Elbrus, 5,462 m high, the highest peak of Kavkaz. Many alpinists consider it as the highest European peak, although officially Mont Blanc (4,807m) is the highest peak, because Elbrus is located on the very Asian border. Although it is 250 m lower than Kilimanjaro, Elbrus is more demanding and dangerous due to its cold climate and unfavorable weather conditions.

The gale-blue sky glitters over Šibenik and somewhere thousands miles far away the tropical sky glitters over Africa, and esp. Moshi, Arusha, Tanga, Manyara, Ngorongoro, Tarangire, Serengeti, villages of Massaia, Bushmen and Datoga, Mt. Meru, mythical slopes of the renowned Kilimanjaro and all the nice people we met during our unforgettable journey. Memories that shall never be forgotten shall remain in our hearts, the scent and dust of savannas on our clothes, and the sounds of virgin-forest, the voices of people, Swahili and the rhythm of Africa in our ears. The angel's touch of Africa transformed itself into an angels' touch of love for all those who waited for us patiently. We felt as if we were the chosen people. We experienced things that only a few could experience. We achieved everything we anticipated when traveling to Africa. We proved that we had a heart, and a heart has the utmost power. All of us managed to climb 5,895 m high Uhuru Peak (Liberty Peak), the highest peak of the highest African mountain, the highest freestanding African mountain and the highest extinguished volcano, Kilimanjaro.

We shall remember this journey until the end of our lives, and even when we shall not be alive our grandchildren shall tell stories about how their grandparents climbed the glittering snow-covered peak of the miraculous Kilimanjaro a long time ago.
